

# MP INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL KASARAGOD ANNUAL REPORT 2024-25



**N**estled in the serene and picturesque surroundings of Periyadka, a suburb of Kasaragod, MP International School stands as a beacon of excellence in education. Established and promoted by MP Charitable Trust, Kasaragod, a registered trust under the Indian Trust Act, the school is dedicated to providing high-quality education while fostering leadership, academic excellence, and cultural values.

Spread across 5.12 acres (2.072 hectares), with an additional 2.5 acres available for future expansion, the school boasts a modern six-storied building that houses world-class amenities essential for a thriving learning environment. The total built-up area of the main school building spans 77,493 sq. ft. (7,199.34 sq. m.), offering ample space for academic and co-

curricular activities.

A sprawling auditorium covering 13,450 sq. ft. (1,250 sq. m.), serving as a vibrant hub for academic and cultural events. A well-stocked library spanning 11,298 sq. ft. (1,050 sq. m.), fostering a love for reading and research. State-of-the-art laboratories for Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Computer Science, fully equipped with modern amenities. Three expansive playgrounds designed to encourage sports and physical development. A well-equipped canteen with ample dining facilities for students and teachers. Living quarters for faculty and staff, ensuring a nurturing and supportive campus environment.

Currently offering classes from Kindergarten to Senior Secondary Level,



MP International School is home to 1559 students guided by a team of 93 seasoned teachers, supported by dedicated administrative and auxiliary staff.

MPIS has made remarkable progress in its journey toward educational excellence. The school became a Learning Centre of North West Accreditation Commission, USA on 31/02/2019, marking its commitment to global educational standards. On 15/06/2021, it received official recognition from the General Education Department of the Government of Kerala, further strengthening its credibility. The institution was accredited by the Cognia Global Commission, USA on 30/06/2022, reinforcing its commitment to international benchmarks in education. Affiliation with CBSE for grades 1 to 10 was secured on 03/09/2021, and the school was subsequently upgraded to Senior Secondary Level by CBSE on 10/05/2022, allowing it to offer a comprehensive academic pathway for students.

MPIS is governed by the MP Charitable Trust, registered under Trust Registration No. 61 of 2011 (Book No. IV, Volume 197, Page 83-90), with its official address at MP Tower, Beach Road, Kasaragod-671121, Kasaragod Taluk and District. The Trust is established and chaired by Dr. M. A. Mohamed Shafi, a leading businessman, industrialist, philanthropist, and social worker. Dr. Shafi, popularly known as M.P. Shafi, has been an NRI living in Qatar for over 50 years and is the Managing Director of M.P. Group of Companies. M.P. Group is involved in multifarious business activities both in Qatar and in India. His involvement in various social, cultural and educational activities both in India and abroad has been well acclaimed. The trust is committed to uplifting economically and socially disadvantaged communities,

particularly the Muslim minority, by providing high-quality education that emphasizes academic brilliance, leadership skills, and cultural heritage.

With a perfect blend of academic rigor, values-based education, and state-of-the-art facilities, MP International School, Kasaragod, is dedicated to shaping the leaders of tomorrow while preserving the essence of our rich traditions.

### **Academic Achievement - Board Examination 2023-24**

The academic year witnessed outstanding board examination results, demonstrating the commitment and hard work of both students and teachers. In the Secondary Board Examinations, all 51 students successfully passed, achieving a 100% success rate. Three students attained an exceptional score of 90% and above, while another three secured 85% and above. Five students scored 80% and above, nine students attained 75% and above, and twelve students achieved 70% and above. Moreover, ten students scored 65% and above, five students secured 60% and above, and four students obtained 50% and above. The school topper, Fathima Neshwa, achieved an impressive 95%, followed by Nafeesath Shadah Rahman and Khadeeja Amnah in second and third places, respectively.

The Senior Secondary Examination results





were equally commendable, with all 16 students passing successfully. Among them, five students scored above 70%, eight students secured 60% and above, and three students achieved 50% and above. Ashir Yousuf, the school topper, scored 78%, excelling in the XII Science stream, while Kadeejath Hasna led at the Higher Secondary level. Abdul Rahiman Adnan secured second place, followed by Aisha Niha, Haleema Nazim, and Sama Fathima, who shared the third position. In the XII Commerce stream, Mafaz MAshraf emerged as the school topper, with Fathima Afna securing second place and Radin Ashraf attaining third place.

## Reopening

The school reopened on 05/06/2024 with a 7% increase in student strength, highlighting its growing recognition and dedication to delivering high-quality education. This remarkable growth showcases the trust and confidence that parents and the community place in MP International School. For Kindergarten, the reopening took place on 06/06/2024, with 145 new students stepping into Junior KG, marking a promising beginning for the youngest learners in our institution. The steady rise in enrollment is a result of the school's focus on academic excellence, holistic development, and the creation of a nurturing learning environment. With an expanding student body, the school continues to enhance its infrastructure, introduce innovative teaching methodologies, and foster a culture of curiosity and lifelong learning. This milestone further strengthens the mission of the school to shape future leaders while upholding its core values of integrity, excellence, and inclusivity.

## Major Events and Celebrations

### June 2024

The month of June opened with a sense of responsibility and commitment as the

## July 2024

## October 2024

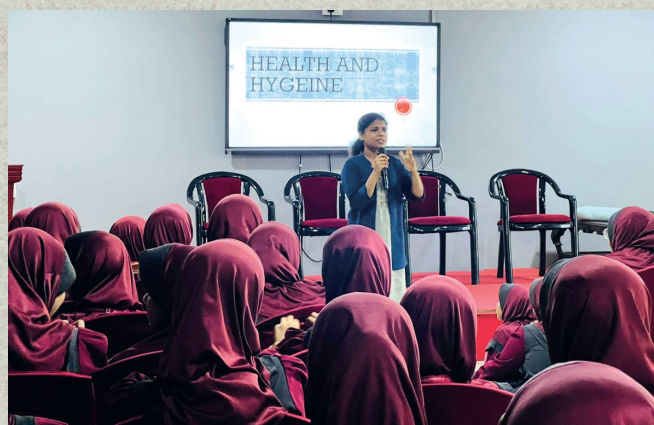

Introducing this innovative evaluation model, MP International School has set a precedent in benchmarking student learning outcomes at an institutional level, providing valuable insights to enhance teaching methodologies and curriculum planning.

### **School Annual/Study Tour**

On November 7, 2024, MP International School organized an exciting annual tour for the Kindergarten, Grade 1 and 2, and Grade 3 to 5 students to Manasa.
